1/ Today, we are announcing a revision of the Class and Component Prices for March 2007 that were announced on March 30, 2007. Federal order language requires these prices be based on weekly prices announced by the National Agricultural Statistics Service (NASS) on or before the 5th day of the month. In setting the price release dates for 2007, we failed to note that NASS was releasing their "Dairy Products Prices" report on Thursday, April 5th. We have determined that prices need to be recalculated using the five weeks of survey prices published in the April 5th NASS report. Consequently, prices and volumes for the survey week ending March 31st are included in the re-calculation.

2/ There is also a \$0.20 per cwt. processor assessment which is an obligation under the Fluid Milk Promotion Order (7 CFR §1160.101 et seq.). The Order requires that all persons who process and market commercially more than 3,000,000 pounds of fluid milk products in consumer-type packages in the 48 contiguous States and the District of Columbia on a monthly basis, excluding those fluid milk products delivered to the residence of a consumer, be assessed 20 cents per hundredweight on all marketings of such packaged fluid milk products during the month.
