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CME Cheese, Butter Prices Increase

Prices for cheddar cheese on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange (CME) decreased in the first half of April, following almost a month of generally rising prices. Cheese prices in 2009 remain volatile, ranging between \$1.03 and \$1.37 per pound. The CME butter price traded steadily around \$1.20 per pound in early April.

On April 16, the CME barrel cheddar cheese price was \$1.11 per pound, down nearly 17¢ from two weeks earlier and down almost 22¢ from a month ago. Prices for 40-pound blocks were \$1.17 per pound on April 16, down 11¢ from two weeks earlier, and nearly 9¢ below a month ago. Both cheese prices are about

10¢ above their 2009 lows, but are about 65¢ below year-earlier levels.

The CME butter price on April 16 was \$1.20¼ per pound, up 1¾¢ from mid-March, but 18½¢ below year-earlier levels.

The March Federal order Class III price was \$10.44 per cwt., up \$1.13 from the February price, but \$7.56 below the March 2008 price.

The April CME Class III futures price is currently at about \$10.76 per cwt. However, by July the CME futures market has the Class III price above \$12.50 and has it trading between \$13.85 and \$15.00 for the rest of the year.

Upper Midwest Order--Sources of Producer Milk

Producer Milk by State

During December 2008, 68.5% of producer milk was received from Wisconsin, with 23% from Minnesota (See Table 1 on Page 2). The remaining producer milk, about 8.5%, was primarily received from Illinois, Iowa, Michigan, and North and South Dakota. In addition, a small quantity of milk was pooled

on the order from each of the states of Idaho, Indiana, and Missouri.

Producer milk in December 2008 totaled 2.3 billion pounds, down 106 million pounds from the previous year. In December 2008, producer milk was received from Indiana, but not in December of either 2007 or 2006,

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Pool Summary

- In March, 15,859 producers delivered to the market with an average daily delivery of 5,622 pounds.
- Producer milk totaled 2.7 billion pounds, up 187 million pounds from February and 570 million pounds above March 2008.
- Class I utilization totaled 376 million pounds, down 4.6% on a daily basis from February, but 1.5% above

March 2008. Class I usage accounted for 14.1% of producer milk.

- The March Producer Price Differential (PPD) is \$0.13 per cwt.
- The Statistical Uniform Price is \$10.57 per cwt., up \$0.75 from February, but \$7.18 below March 2008.
- Market statistics for March are shown on Pages 4 and 5.

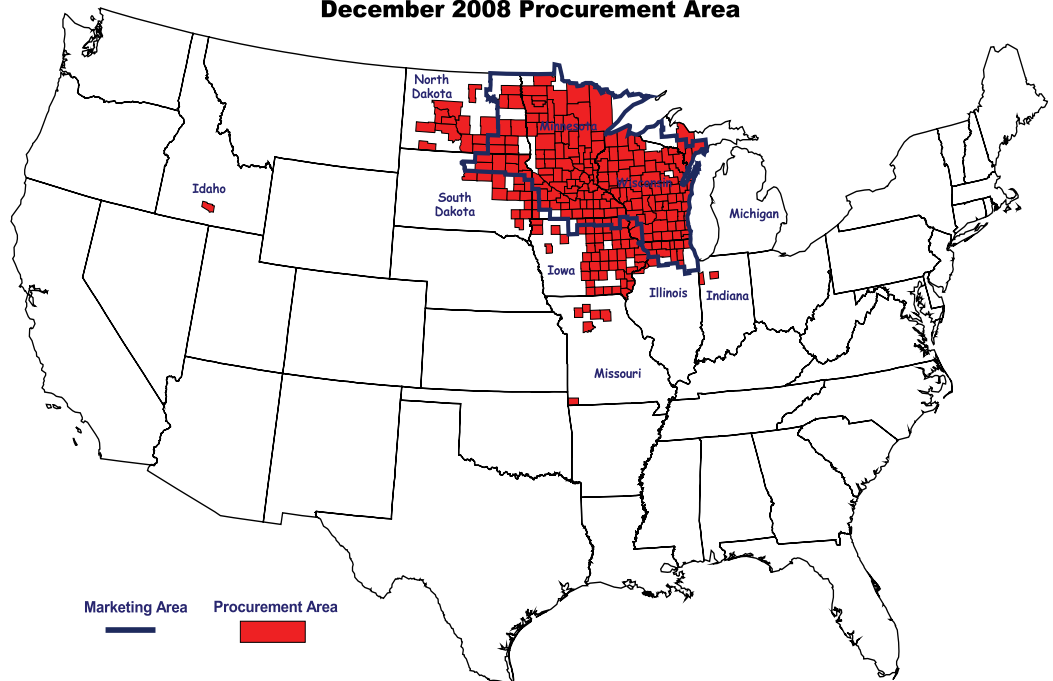
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while no producer milk was received from Montana and Nebraska in December 2008 after having producer milk in December of 2007 or 2006.

Table 1 shows, for December 2008, the number of counties from which producer milk was received, the number of producers, and pounds of producer milk represented by each state. In addition, the percentage of producer milk represented by each state is shown for December of 2008, 2007, and 2006.

The map to the right graphically shows the states and counties from which producer milk was received in December 2008.

Producer Milk for 15 Top Counties

The 15 top counties from which producer milk was received in December 2008 are shown in Table 2 below, along with the number of producers and pounds of producer milk represented by each county. The rank, number of producers and pounds of producer milk for those same counties for December 2007 are also shown.

Wisconsin has 13 of the top 15 counties in December 2008, and Minnesota has the other two.

The makeup of the top 15 counties in December 2008 remained unchanged from a year earlier, with Stearns County, Minnesota ranked first in both years.

There was, however, some shifting in the rank among the top 15 counties. For example, Fond du Lac and Clark counties in Wisconsin swapped places, with

Fond du Lac rising from a rank of 7 in 2007 to a rank of 3 in 2008, and Clark County falling from 3 to 7.

The top 15 counties supplied 40% of total producer milk on the order in December 2008, and accounted for 35% of the producers.

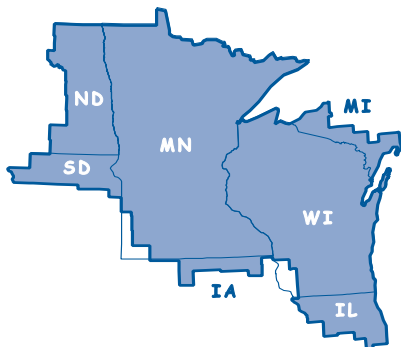
