## USDA Issues Recommended Decision Amending Producer-Handler Definitions

The U.S. Department of Agriculture recently issued a recommended decision to adopt amendments to the producer-handler definition in all Federal milk marketing orders. This decision is based on testimony and evidence given at a public hearing held May 4-19 in Cincinnati, Ohio.

The decision recommends that the producer-handler definitions of all Federal milk marketing orders be amended to limit exemption from pooling and pricing provisions of the orders to those producer-handlers with total route disposition of fluid milk products of 3 million pounds or less per month. The exempt plant definition would continue to limit disposition of Class I milk products to 150,000 pounds or less per month.

Comments on the decision must be submitted on or before December 21, 2009.

## Pool Summary

- In September, producer milk totaled 2.39 billion pounds, down 254 million pounds from August, and 137 million pounds below September 2008.
- Class I utilization totaled 371 million pounds, up 8% on a daily basis from August. Class I usage accounted for 15.5% of producer milk.
- Class III utilization totaled 1.8 billion pounds and accounted for 76.3% of producer milk.
- The September Producer Price Differential (PPD) is \$0.03 per cwt.
- The Statistical Uniform Price is \$12.14 per cwt., up \$0.82 from August, but \$4.71 below September 2008.
- Market statistics for September are shown on Pages 4 and 5.

# U.S. Milk Production Down

## September Down 0.7%

Estimated United States milk production during September totaled 15.0 billion pounds, down 0.7% from September 2008. U.S. production per cow is estimated at 1,647 pounds for September, up 24 pounds, or 1.5%, from a year earlier. The estimated number of cows on U.S. farms in September was 9.1 million head, 197,000 head less than September 2008.

For the top six milk producing states,

production in September 2009, compared to September 2008, was up 5.2% in Wisconsin, 3.9% in Minnesota, and 1.0% in Pennsylvania, but down 6.4% in California, 2.3% in Idaho, and 1.4% in New York.

## July-September Decreased

U.S. milk production for the first nine months of 2009 was up 0.2% from the same period in 2008, adjusted for leap year (see Table 1 below).

However, July-September production decreased by 0.3%, compared to an increase of 0.4% for the January-June period (see Figure 1). As shown in Figure 1, production losses from the previous year accelerated in the third quarter in California and Idaho, but gains accelerated in Wisconsin and Minnesota.

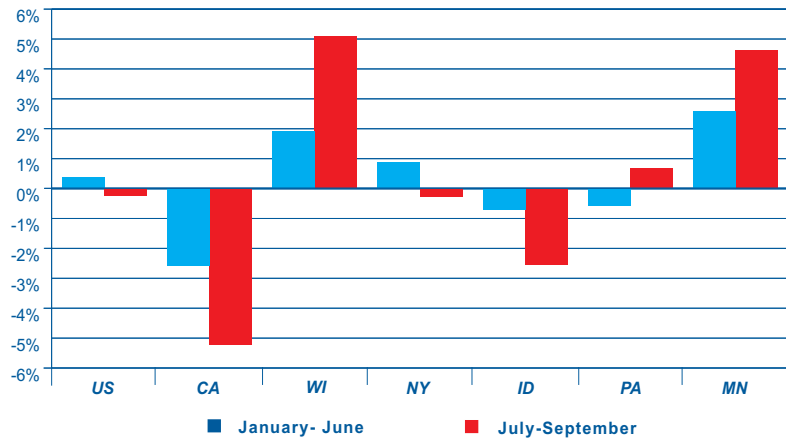
It is likely that the decrease in milk production in the third quarter of 2009 is one of several factors for the recent recovery in dairy commodity prices. (See the related article on Page 3.)

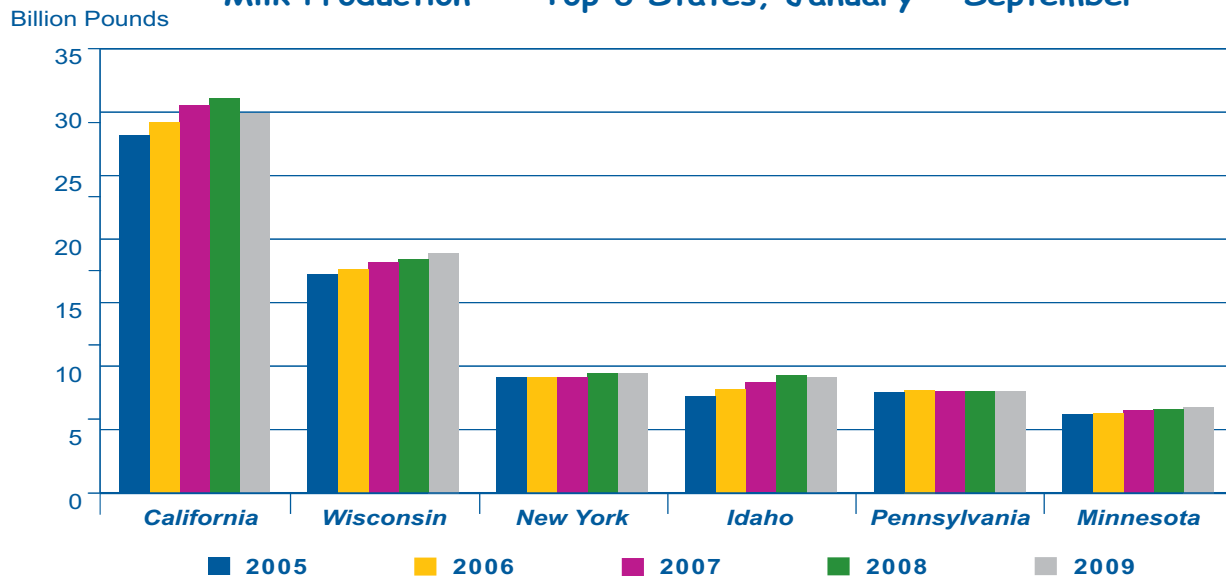

## Cheese and Butter Prices Increase

Prices for cheddar cheese on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange (CME) increased about 10¢ from mid-September to mid-October. The butter price on the CME was up 3¢.

As can be seen in the graph below, the CME barrel and block prices retreated slightly after they had risen to this year's high of \$1.45¾ and \$1.50¾ per pound, respectively. The barrel price on October 20 was \$1.42¼ per pound, up 11¢ from September 21, while the 40-

pound block price of \$1.43 per pound was up 7¼¢ in that time frame. Barrel and block prices, however, were more than 35¢ below year-earlier levels.

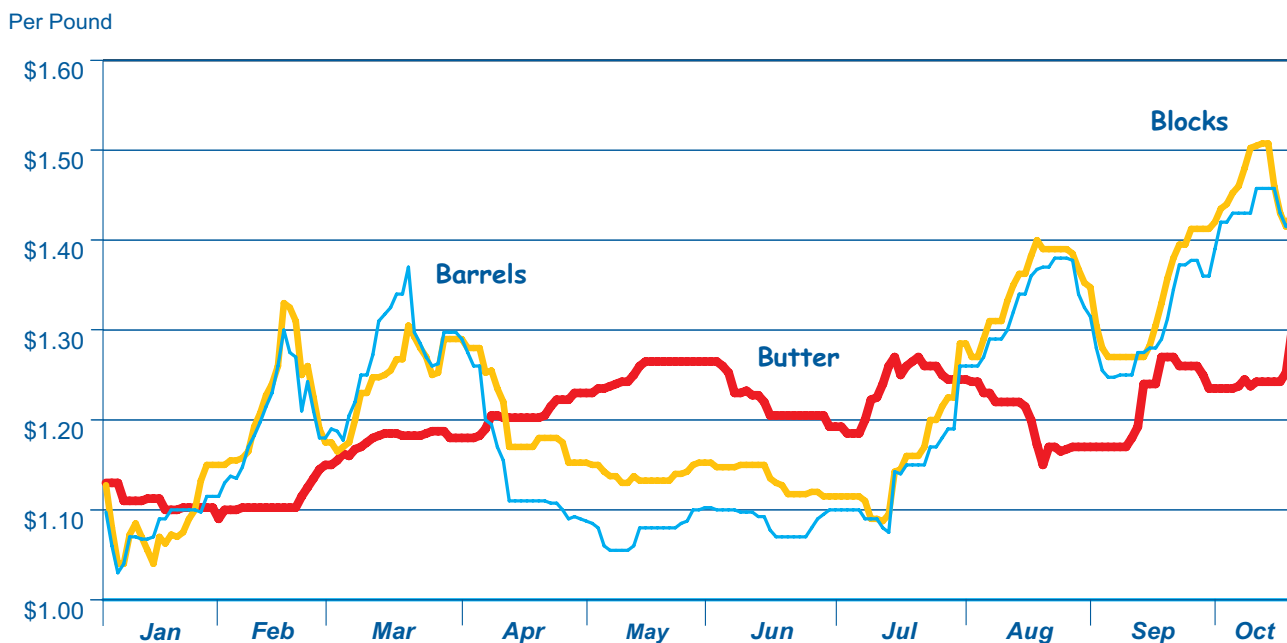
The CME butter price also rose to this year's high of \$1.30 per pound on October 20, up 3¢ from September 21. The year-earlier level for the CME butter was \$1.74 per pound, nearly 45¢ above the current level.

Nonfat dry milk prices on the CME on

October 20 were \$1.26 per pound for Extra Grade and \$1.31½ per pound for Grade A, up 26¢ and 27½¢, respectively, from September 21. The Extra Grade and Grade A prices are above year-earlier levels by 26¢ and 31¢, respectively.

The September Federal order Class III price was \$12.11 per cwt., up 91¢ from August, but \$4.17 below September 2008. The CME Class III futures prices for 2010 trend upwards and range from \$14.70 to \$15.70 per cwt.

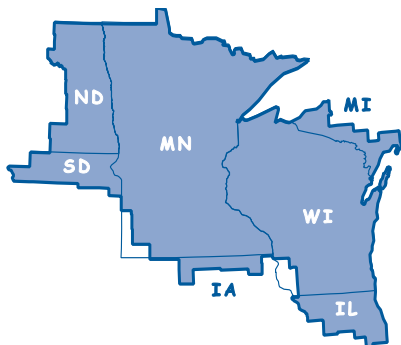
## Summary of Federal Order Data - September 2009
