<sup>\*</sup> In light of litigation commenced in United States District Court for the Northern District of Ohio, the manufacturing allowances used to compute the Federal order minimum advance Class I and Class II prices and pricing factors in this announcement are the current manufacturing allowances, rather than the revised manufacturing allowances contained in the Interim Final Rule published in the Federal Register on December 29, 2006 (71 FR 78333-78335). As long as the Interim Final Rule is not enjoined as a result of the litigation, Federal order minimum prices for Class III and Class IV milk for February 2007, as well as the Federal order minimum advance Class I and Class II prices and pricing factors for March 2007 and thereafter, will be computed using the revised manufacturing allowances contained in the Final Rule.

<sup>1/</sup> There is also a \$0.20 per cwt. processor assessment which is an obligation under the Fluid Milk Promotion Order (7 CFR §1160.101 et seq.). The Order requires that all persons who process and market commercially more than 3,000,000 pounds of fluid milk products in consumer-type packages in the 48 contiguous States and the District of Columbia on a monthly basis, excluding those fluid milk products delivered to the residence of a consumer, be assessed 20 cents per hundredweight on all marketings of such packaged fluid milk products during the month.
