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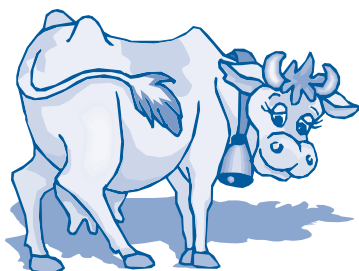
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Hearing Held in Upper Midwest Order

A public hearing was held in Bloomington, Minnesota on June 26-27, 2001 to consider proposals primarily pertaining to standards for pooling milk on the Upper Midwest Federal Milk Order.

Some of the proponents have requested that this issue be

handled on an emergency basis.

During the two-day hearing, testimony was received from 19 witnesses with 37 exhibits received. Briefs on the hearing record are to be filed with the hearing clerk's office no later than July 25, 2001.

Producer Milk by State and County

During March 2001, producer milk for the Upper Midwest order was received from 251 counties in nine states. The table on Pages 2 and 3 contains those producer receipts as well as the number of producers by state and county.

During the month, nearly 50% of producer milk was received from Wisconsin, with more than 29% received

from Minnesota, and about 16% received from California. The remaining milk, about 5%, was primarily received from Illinois and North and South Dakota. In addition, a small quantity of milk was pooled on the order from each of the states of Iowa, Michigan, and Montana.

The top five counties from which producer milk was

received in March 2001, in declining order of quantity delivered, were: Stearns, Minnesota; Dane, Wisconsin; Marathon, Wisconsin; Clark, Wisconsin; and Merced, California.

The combined receipts from the top five counties accounted for about 16% of total producer milk for the month.

Pool Summary

- In June, 12,748 producers delivered to the market with an average daily delivery of 4,050 pounds.
- Producer milk totaled 1.5 billion pounds, down 2% on a daily basis from May.
- Class I utilization totaled 300

million pounds, down 6% on a daily basis from May.

- Class I usage accounted for 19.8% of producer milk.
- The June Producer Price Differential is \$0.50 per cwt.
- The Statistical Uniform Price is \$15.52 per cwt., up \$1.02 from May and \$5.09 above June 2000.
- Market statistics for June are shown on Pages 4 and 5.

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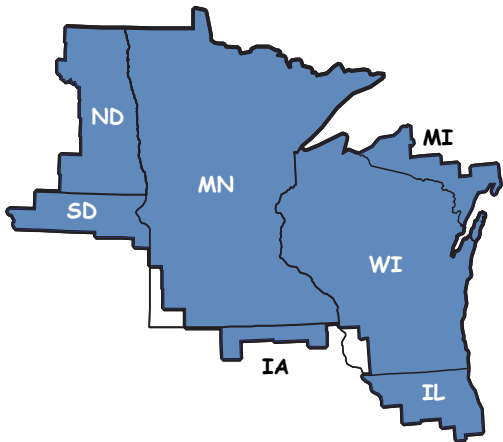
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
