Lloyd Day Named Administrator of AMS

loyd C. Day was announced as Administrator of USDA's Agricultural Marketing Service (AMS) by Secretary of Agriculture Mike Johanns on August 5, 2005. Day is responsible for a wide range of programs that facilitate the domestic and international marketing of U.S. agricultural goods.

Since 2002, Day had served as special assistant to the Administrator of the Foreign Agricultural Service at USDA. In this role, he was responsible for coordinating all USDA activities with Mexico.

Prior to coming to USDA, Day worked as a business development director and industry marketing manager at Tumbleweed Communications in Redwood City, California from 1999-2002. He also served as Deputy Secretary of International Trade and Investment with the California Trade and Commerce Agency in Governor Pete Wilson's Administration from 1996-1999.

Day received a bachelor's and master's degree from Stanford University and a second master's degree from the University of Glasgow in Scotland.

Day is a native of Sacramento, California and now resides in Alexandria, Virginia.

CME Cheese, Butter Prices Up

Cheddar cheese cash prices on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange (CME) increased from mid-August to mid-September. The CME barrel price on September 14 was \$1.50 per pound, up 9¾¢ from mid-August, while the 40-pound block price of \$1.56½ was up 14¢ from mid-August. Both prices are similar to year-earlier levels.

The CME butter price on September 14 was \$1.72 per pound, up $1\frac{1}{4}$ ¢ from mid-August but 3¢ below year-earlier levels. The August Federal order Class III price of \$13.60 per cwt. was down 75¢ from July and 44¢ below the August 2004 price.

Pool Summary

- ➤ In August, 16,504 producers delivered to the market with an average daily delivery of 4,276 pounds.
- ➤ Producer milk totaled 2.17 billion pounds, up 162 million pounds from July, and 172 million pounds above August 2004.
- Class I utilization totaled 381 million pounds, up 12.7% from July. Class I
- usage accounted for 17.5% of producer milk.
- ➤ The August Producer Price Differential (PPD) is \$0.55 per cwt.
- The Statistical Uniform Price is \$14.15 per cwt., down \$0.54 from July and \$0.11 below August 2004.
- ➤ Market statistics for August are shown on Pages 4 and 5.

The Secretary of Agriculture recently appointed ten new members and reappointed two incumbents to the National Dairy Promotion and Research Board. All will serve three-year terms ending October 31, 2008. The list below shows the 36 members of the national board effective November 1, 2005. A map showing the 13 regions is shown on Page 3.

The National Dairy Promotion and Research Board, established by the Dairy Production Stabilization Act of 1983, administers a coordinated program of promotion, research and nutrition education. The board's activities are financed by a mandatory 15¢ per cwt. assessment on milk produced in the contiguous 48 states and marketed commercially by dairy farmers. USDA's Agricultural Marketing Service monitors the activities of the board
