CME Cheese Prices Down, Butter Up

Prices for cheddar cheese on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange (CME) decreased slightly from mid-September to mid-October.

The CME barrel price on October 16 was \$1.23½ per pound, down 5¼¢ from September 18, while the 40-pound block price of \$1.23¼ was down 5½¢ from September 18. The year-earlier levels for CME barrel and block prices were \$1.42 and \$1.46¼, respectively.

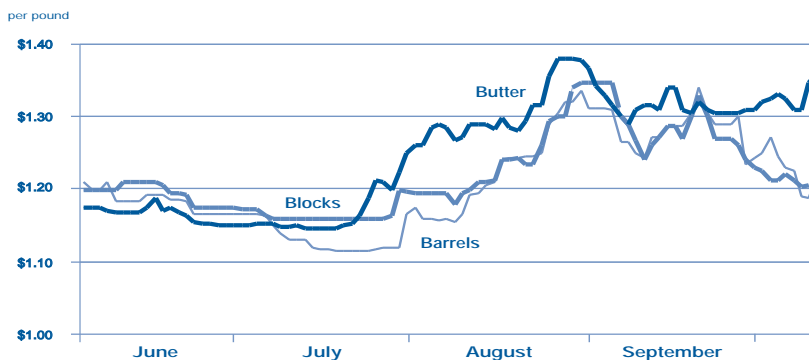
According to USDA's *Dairy Market News*, added capacity and new plants producing

cheddar blocks in recent years are disrupting typical fall cheese supply and demand patterns.

The CME butter price on October 16 was \$1.36 per pound, up 2¢ from September 18. The year-earlier level for the CME butter price was \$1.64¾, nearly 30¢ above current levels.

The September Federal order Class III price of \$12.29 per cwt. was up \$1.23 from August but \$2.01 below the September 2005 price.

Pool Summary

- In September, 14,892 producers delivered to the market with an average daily delivery of 4,511 pounds.
- Producer milk totaled 1.9 billion pounds, down 481 million pounds from August, and 138 million pounds below September 2005.
- Class I utilization totaled 391 million pounds, up 3.9% on a daily basis

from August. Class I usage accounted for 20.2% of producer milk.

- The September Producer Price Differential (PPD) is \$0.08 per cwt.
- The Statistical Uniform Price is \$12.37 per cwt., up \$0.94 from August, but \$2.22 below September 2005.
- Market statistics for September are shown on Pages 4 and 5.

Members Named to National Dairy Board

The Secretary of Agriculture recently appointed seven new members and reappointed five incumbents to the National Dairy Promotion and Research Board. All will serve three-year terms ending October 31, 2009. The list below shows the 36 members of the national board effective November 1, 2006. A map showing the 13 regions is shown on Page 3.

The National Dairy Promotion and Research Board, established by the Dairy Production Stabilization Act of 1983, administers a coordinated program of promotion, research and nutrition education. The board's activities are financed by a mandatory 15¢ per cwt. assessment on milk produced in the contiguous 48 states and marketed commercially by dairy farmers. USDA's Agricultural Marketing Service monitors the activities of the board.

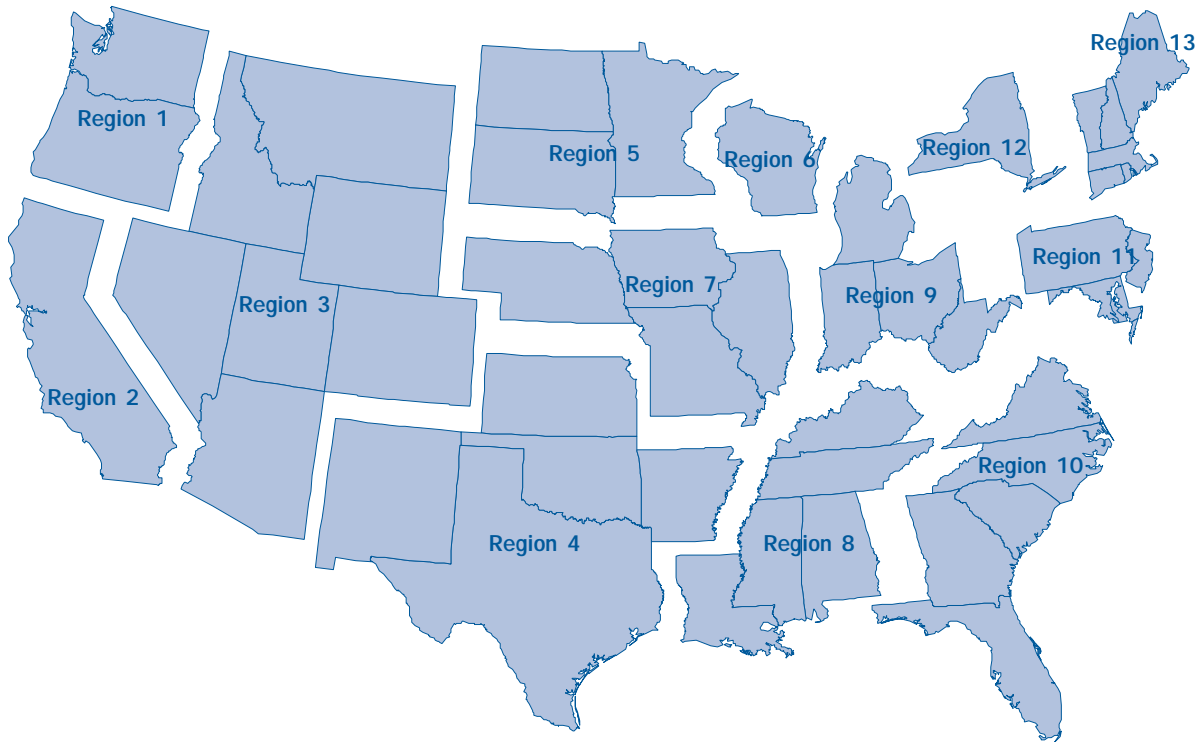

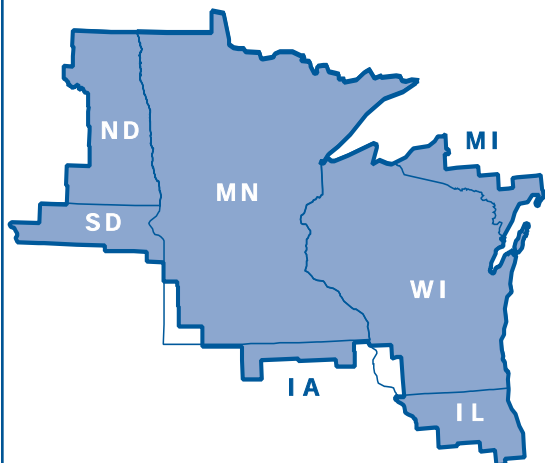
