Final Rule for Dairy Forward Pricing Program

On October 31, 2008, the U.S. Department of Agriculture announced a final rule establishing the Dairy Forward Pricing Program as directed by the Food, Conservation and Energy Act of 2008. This rule became effective November 3, 2008.

This program will allow milk producers and cooperative associations to voluntarily enter into forward price contracts with milk handlers for milk used for non-fluid purposes.

The program exempts handlers regulated under the Federal milk order program from paying producers and cooperative associations the minimum Federal order price for milk under forward contract.

Pool Summary

- In October, 14,313 producers delivered to the market with an average daily delivery of 5,296 pounds.
- Producer milk totaled 2.2 billion pounds, down 356 million pounds from September and 170 million pounds below October 2007.
- Class I utilization totaled 399 million pounds, up 2% from September on a daily basis, but nearly 1% below October 2007. Class I usage accounted for 18.3% of producer milk.
- The October Producer Price Differential (PPD) is \$(0.04) per cwt.
- The Statistical Uniform Price is \$17.02 per cwt., up \$0.17 from September, but \$2.51 below October 2007.
- Market statistics for October are shown on Pages 4 and 5.

Members Named to National Dairy Board

The U.S. Department of Agriculture has announced the appointment of eight new members and reappointment of five incumbents to the National Dairy Promotion and Research Board. Twelve appointees will serve three-year terms ending October 31, 2011, and one appointee from Region 2 will serve a two-year term ending October 31, 2010. The list below shows the 36 members of the national board effective November 1, 2008. A map showing the 13 regions is shown on Page 3.

The National Dairy Promotion and Research Board, established by the Dairy Production Stabilization Act of 1983, administers a coordinated program of promotion, research and nutrition education. The board's activities are financed by a mandatory 15¢ per cwt. assessment on milk produced in the contiguous 48 states and marketed commercially by dairy farmers. USDA's Agricultural Marketing Service monitors the activities of the board.

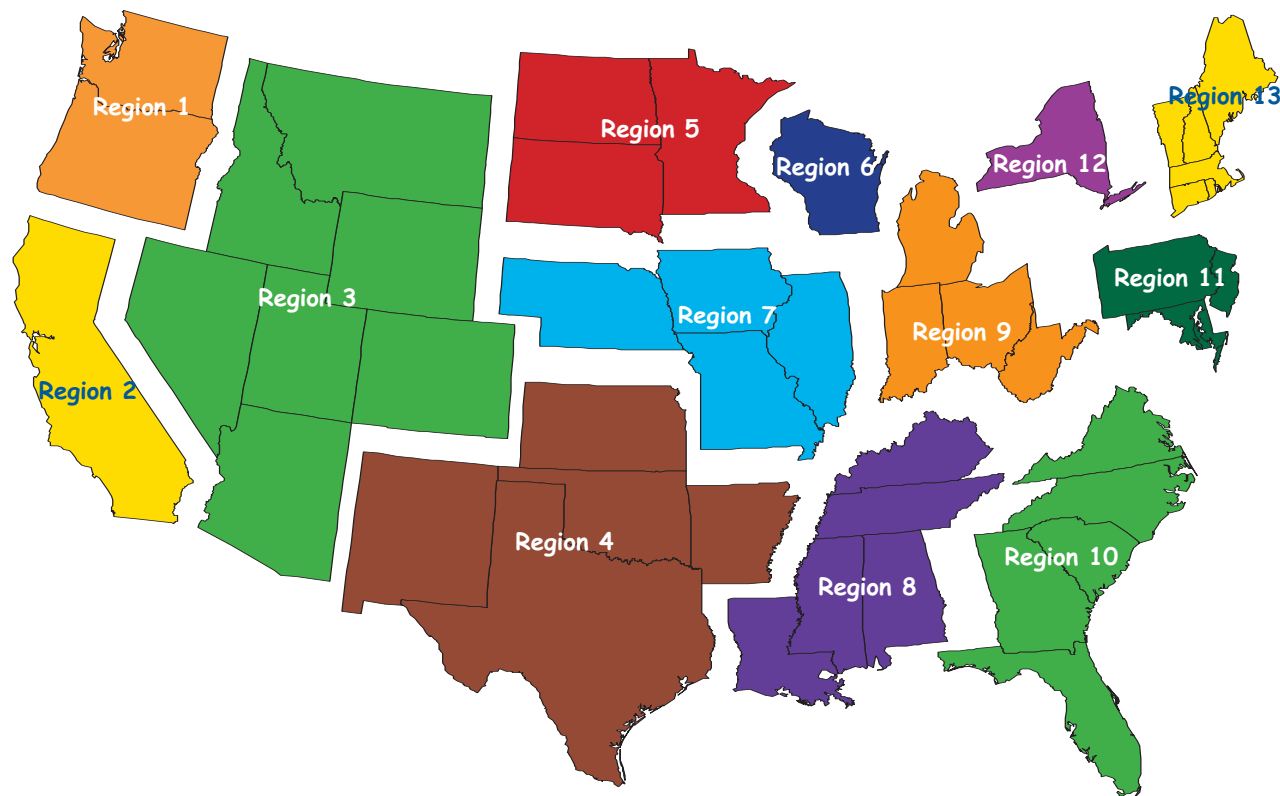

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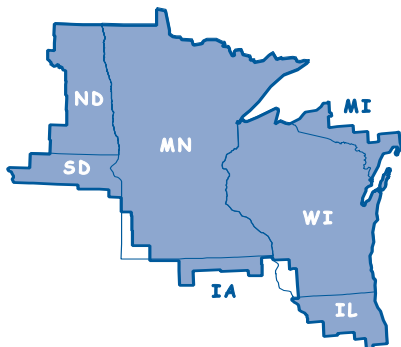
