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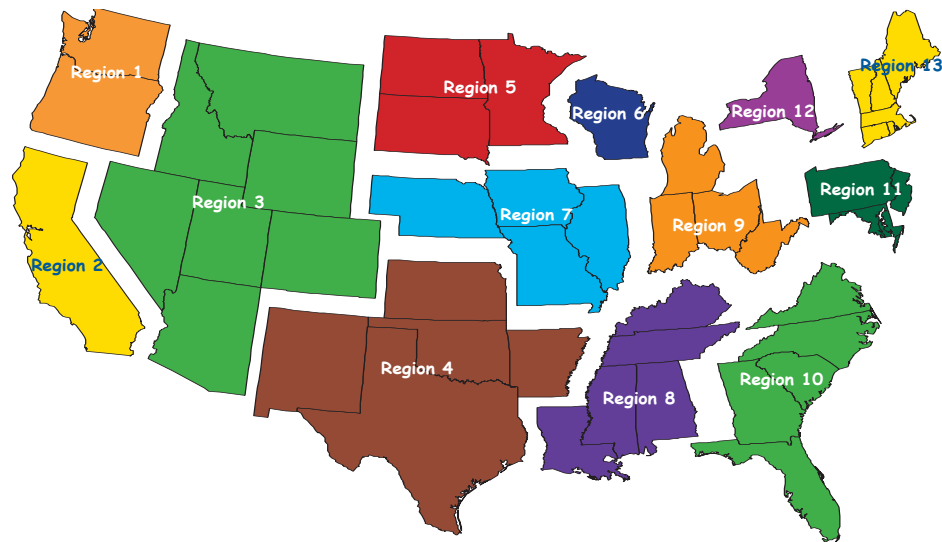
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Members Named to National Dairy Board

The U.S. Department of Agriculture has announced the appointment of ten new members and reappointment of two incumbents to the National Dairy Promotion and Research Board. All appointees will serve three-year terms ending October 31, 2012. The list on page 2 shows the current 36 members of the national board. A map showing the 13 regions is shown below.

The National Dairy Promotion and Research Board, established by the Dairy Production Stabilization Act of 1983, administers a coordinated program of promotion, research and nutrition education. The board's activities are financed by a mandatory 15¢ per cwt. assessment on milk produced in the contiguous 48 states and marketed commercially by dairy farmers. USDA's Agricultural Marketing Service monitors the activities of the board.

Pool Summary

- In February, producer milk totaled 2.6 billion pounds, down 239 million pounds from January, but 154 million pounds above February 2009.
- Class I utilization totaled 347 million pounds, up 2.9% from January on a daily basis. Class I usage accounted for 13.1% of producer milk.
- Class III utilization totaled 2.2 billion pounds and accounted for 82.1% of producer milk.
- The February Producer Price Differential (PPD) is \$0.34 per cwt.
- The Statistical Uniform Price is \$14.62 per cwt., down \$0.14 from January, but \$4.80 above February 2009.
- Market statistics for February are shown on Pages 4 and 5.

Edward Avalos, Under Secretary for Marketing and Regulatory Programs

Edward Avalos is the Under Secretary for Marketing and Regulatory Programs at the U.S. Department

of Agriculture. Mr. Avalos provides leadership and oversight for the Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service, which addresses animal and plant pests and diseases; the Agricultural Marketing Service, which provides standardization testing and marketing of commodities and specialty crops; and the Grain Inspection, Packers and Stockyards Administration, which promotes marketing of livestock, cereals and meats, as well as fair trade practices.

Mr. Avalos grew up on a family farm in the Mesilla Valley of Southern New Mexico. Prior to his appointment at USDA, he served as Director of Marketing and Development at the New Mexico Department of Agriculture. He has over 30 years experience in livestock and agriculture marketing in both

the domestic and international arenas. Mr. Avalos has spent considerable time working closely with producers to address industry demands; with distributors to ensure timely and feasible delivery of goods; and with retailers to showcase, promote, sell, merchandise, and inform the consumer utilizing numerous promotional and educational tools.

In addition, Mr. Avalos has worked on “buy local” initiatives, Indian agriculture and numerous promotional and trade activities with industry organizations and other stakeholder groups.

Mr. Avalos holds Bachelor of Science and Master of Science degrees in Agriculture from New Mexico State University in Las Cruces, New Mexico.

Cheese and Butter Prices Volatile

Prices for cheddar cheese on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange (CME) were volatile from mid-February to mid-March. However, they have stabilized somewhat after their steady decline in the last few weeks.

Barrels and blocks closed at \$1.26³/₄ and \$1.26³/₄ per pound on March 17, down 15¹/₄¢ and 17³/₄¢, respectively, from February 17. The barrel price was 7³/₄¢ below the year-earlier level, while the block price was unchanged from a year ago.

The CME butter price was also unsteady; it fell slightly after its recent rebound from this year’s low of \$1.31 per pound in early February. Butter closed at \$1.45 per pound on March 17, up 11¹/₂¢ from February 17. The year-earlier price for butter was \$1.18¹/₂ per pound, 26¹/₂¢ below the current level.

Nonfat dry milk (NFDM) prices on the CME on March 17 were \$1.12 per pound for Extra Grade and \$1.11¹/₂ per pound for Grade A, down 12¢ and ¹/₂¢, respectively, from February 17. The NFDM

prices are above year-earlier levels by nearly 30¢.

The February Federal order Class III price was \$14.28 per cwt., down 22¢ from January, but \$4.97 above February 2009. The CME Class III futures prices on March 17 for the second half of 2010 ranged from \$13.97 to \$15.01 per cwt.

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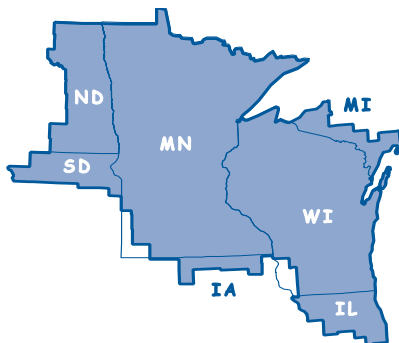
