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## Cheese and Butter Prices Recover Slightly

Prices for cheddar cheese on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange (CME) fell sharply during March and early April, before recovering slightly by mid-month, with butter following a similar pattern on a smaller scale.

The CME barrel cheddar cheese price on April 15 was \$1.62½ per pound, down 35½¢ from its peak in March, but 11½¢ above its April low. The 40-pound block price of \$1.62¼ per pound on April 15 more than 39¢ below its peak, but 5¼¢ above its low point. Barrel and block prices are more than 20¢ above year-earlier levels.

The CME butter price on April 15 was \$2.00 per pound, down 12¢ from its March peak, but up 2¾¢ from its April low point. The butter price is more than 40¢ above a year-earlier.

The March Federal order Class III price was \$19.40 per cwt., up \$2.40 from February, and \$6.62 above March 2010. The April CME Class III futures price on April 15 closed at \$16.74 per cwt., with May and June at about \$16.75 and \$17.50, respectively. The futures prices for the second half of the year averaged about \$17.50 per cwt.

## Upper Midwest Order--Sources of Producer Milk

### Producer Milk by State

During December 2010, 67% of producer milk was received from Wisconsin, with 24% from Minnesota (See Table 1 on Page 2). The remaining producer milk, about 9%, was primarily received from Illinois, Iowa, and North and South Dakota. In addition, a small quantity of milk was pooled on the order from

each of the states of Idaho, Indiana, Michigan, and Missouri.

Producer milk in December 2010 totaled 2.8 billion pounds, up 681 million pounds from the previous year. In December 2009, producer milk was received from Nebraska, but not in December of 2010.

## Pool Summary

- In March, producer milk totaled 2.61 billion pounds, up 33 million pounds from February, but 335 million pounds below March 2010.
- Class I utilization totaled 371 million pounds, down 1.8% from February on a daily basis. Class I usage accounted for 14.2% of producer milk.
- Class III utilization totaled 2.0 billion pounds and accounted for 77.9% of producer milk.
- The March Producer Price Differential (PPD) was \$0.03 per cwt.
- The Statistical Uniform Price was \$19.43 per cwt., up \$2.20 from February and \$6.14 above March 2010.
- Market statistics for March are shown on Pages 4 and 5.

The number of counties from which producer milk was received, the number of producers, and pounds of producer milk represented by each state in December 2010 are shown in Table 1 above. In addition, the percentage of producer milk represented by each state is shown for December of 2010, 2009, and 2008.

The map to the right depicts the states and counties from which producer milk was received in December 2010.

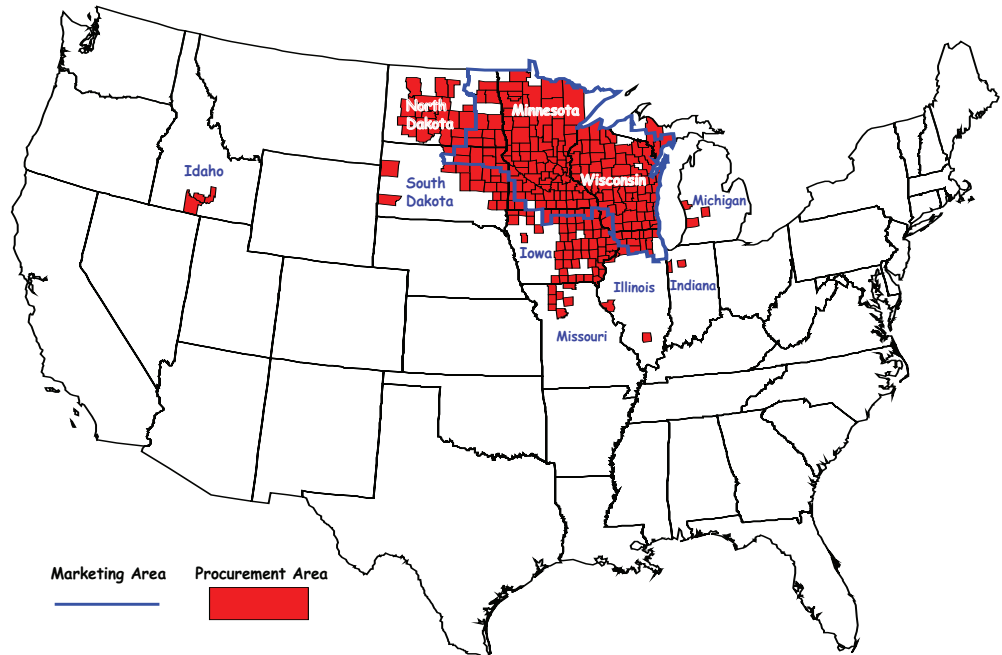


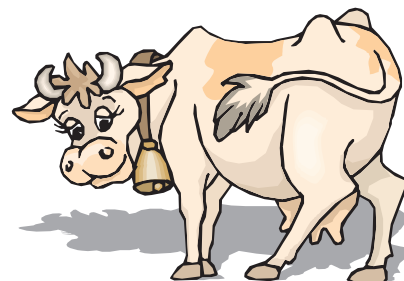
Table 2 below, along with the number of producers and pounds of producer milk represented by each county. The rank, number of producers and pounds of producer milk for those same counties for December 2009 are also shown.

Wisconsin has 13 of the top 15 counties in December 2010, and Minnesota has the other two. The makeup of the top 15 counties in December 2010 was slightly different from a year earlier. The county ranked 15th in 2010, Morrison, Minnesota, was 22nd in 2009, pushing Winona County, Minnesota, ranked 15th in 2009, out of the top 15 in 2010.

There also was some shifting among the counties that remained in the top 15 in both years. Stearns County, Minnesota stayed in the top spot in both years, however, with Manitowoc County, Wisconsin staying at second. All of the other counties shifted rank between the two years, with the exception of Kewaunee County, Wisconsin in the 8th spot both years.

The top 15 counties supplied 38% of total producer milk on the order in December 2010, and accounted for 34% of the producers.

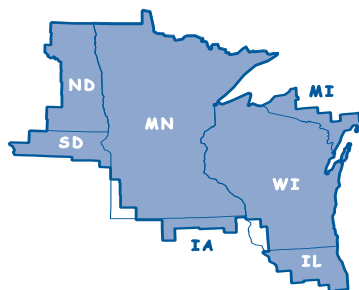

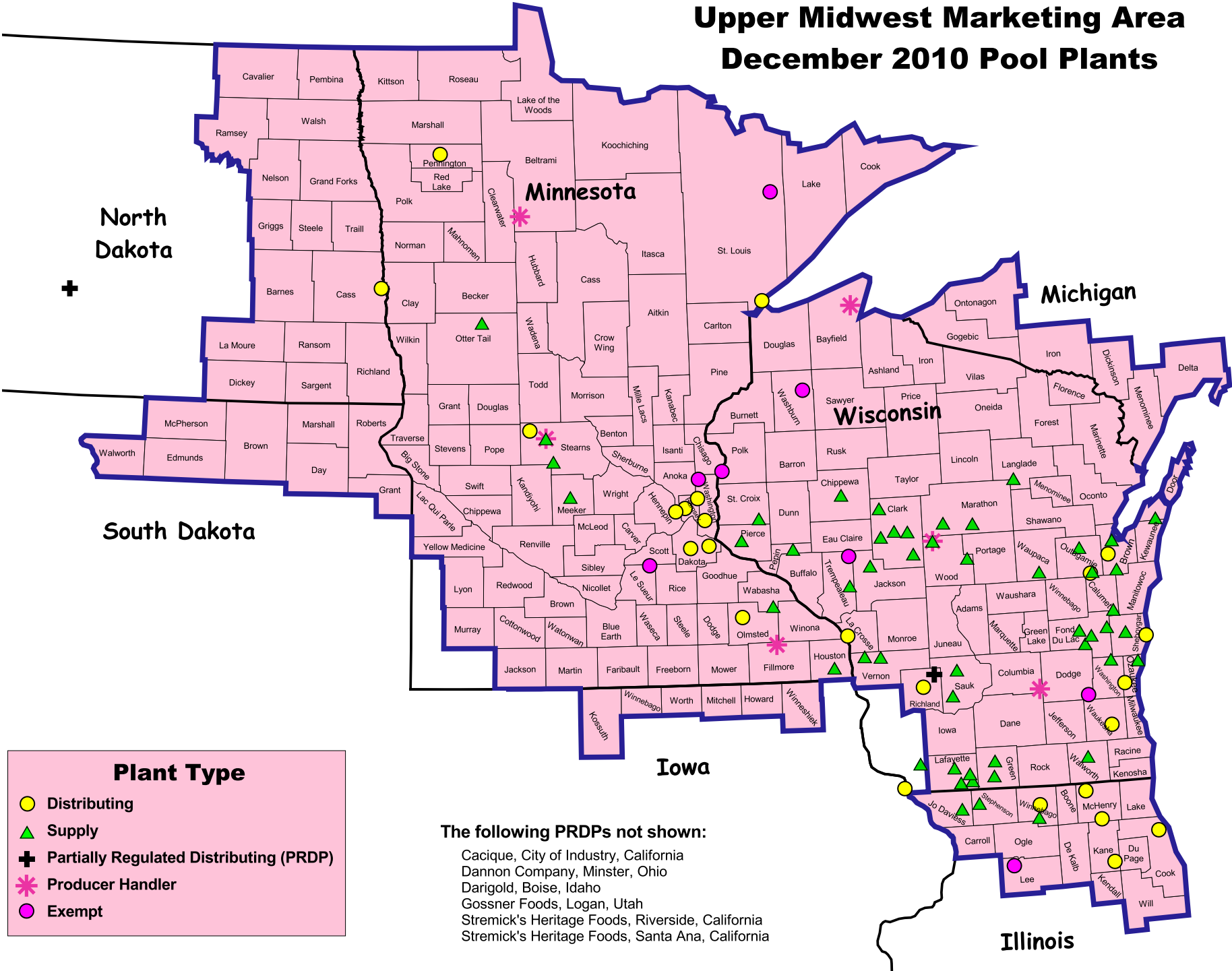
