#### Cheese and Butter Prices Up for Month

Prices for cheddar cheese on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange (CME) for barrels and 40-pound blocks climbed to \$1.61 and \$1.73 per pound, respectively, in October, with the butter price falling most of the month before jumping  $17\phi$  in the last week.

On October 28, the CME barrel cheese price closed at \$1.59\% per pound, up 11\%\psi\$ from a month earlier, but 1\%\psi\$ below the monthly high. The 40-pound block price of \$1.73 on October 28 was up 19\%\psi\$ from a month earlier.


The CME butter price closed at \$1.92½ per pound on October 28, up ½¢ from a month

earlier, but 17¢ above the low point for the month of \$1.75½.

The CME Grade A nonfat dry milk (NFDM) price was down 9¾¢ per pound from a month earlier, closing at \$0.85½ on October 28.

The September Federal order Class III price of \$16.39 per cwt. was down \$0.52 from August, but \$0.57 above September 2015. The October 28 CME Class III futures market has the price at dropping to \$14.78 for October, rising to \$15.69 for November, and then staying below \$16 for several months.

#### Pool Summary

- ➤ In September, producer milk totaled 2.3 billion pounds, up 139 million pounds from August, but 130 million pounds below September 2015.
- ➤ Class I utilization totaled 290 million pounds, up 4.5% from August on a daily basis, but 0.3% below last year. Class I usage accounted for 12.6% of producer milk.
- Class III utilization totaled 1.7 billion

- pounds and accounted for 74.5% of producer milk.
- ➤ The September Producer Price Differential (PPD) was \$(0.02) per cwt.
- ➤ The Statistical Uniform Price was \$16.37 per cwt., down \$0.29 from August, but \$0.17 above September 2015.
- ➤ Market statistics for September are shown on Pages 4, and 5.

#### Upper Midwest Order--Sources of Producer Milk

During December 2015, more than 69% of producer milk was received from Wisconsin, with over 21% from Minnesota (See Table 1 below).

The remaining producer milk, about 9%, was primarily received from Illinois, Iowa, Michigan, and North and South Dakota. In addition, a small quantity of milk was pooled on the order from each of the states of Idaho, Indiana, Missouri, Nebraska, New Mexico, and Texas. (See the map to the right which depicts the states and counties from which producer milk was received in December 2015.)

Producer milk in December 2015 totaled 3.1 billion pounds, up 213 million pounds from the previous year. December was the first of





six consecutive months of producer milk topping the three billion pound mark.

The number of counties from which producer milk was received, the number of producers, and pounds of producer milk represented by each state in December 2015 are shown in Table 1. In addition, the percentage of producer milk represented by each state is shown for December of 2015, 2014, and 2013.

# Producer Milk for the 15 Top Counties

The 15 top counties from which producer milk was received in December 2015 are shown in Table 2 below, along with the number of producers and pounds of producer milk represented by each county. The rank, number of producers and pounds of producer milk for those same counties for December 2014 are also shown.

Wisconsin has 12 of the top 15 counties in December 2015, and Minnesota has the other three. The makeup of the top 15 counties in December 2015 was slightly different from a year earlier. Rising into the top 15, Stevens County, Minnesota, with only 10 producers, pushed Waupaca County, Wisconsin, ranked 15th in 2014, out of the top 15 in 2015.

There also was some shifting among the counties that remained in the top 15 in both years. Most notably, Fond du Lac County, Wisconsin was ranked 8th in 2014, but jumped to 1st in 2015, with a

gain of 40 million pounds. The other changes in ranking can be observed in Table 2.

The top 15 counties supplied 41% of total producer milk on the order in December 2015, and accounted for 34% of the producers.


